DGBMT Student Competition



Regulations

What is the goal of the competition?

The DGBMT Student Competition recognises significant, high-quality research performed by a student researcher during his/her studies in the field of biomedical engineering. The prize is awarded during the BMT Annual Conference.

Who can submit a contribution?

Any individual enrolled in a university of applied sciences who is not older than 30 years and is a member of DGBMT can submit. A permanent faculty member needs to endorse the submission.

What are the participation conditions?

The following conditions must be met for participation:

- Only full papers (2-4 pages) can be reviewed. Abstract submission for the competition is not possible.
- The submission must stem from a bachelor's, master's, diploma, or doctoral thesis. The doctoral thesis must not be completed (deadline: beginning of the conference), while all other works must be completed.
- For doctoral thesis, the confirmation date of submission of mandatory copies to the university library (receipt required) applies.
- The age of the submitting individual must not exceed 30 years (date of birth) on the last day of the conference.
- In case a publication has multiple authors, the prize will be awarded to the author whose contribution to the work is predominant (a statement from all authors acknowledging this fact is required).
- The work must be endorsed by a permanent faculty member of the university where the work was performed. A faculty member can endorse a maximum of three contributions per year. The endorsing faculty member does not need to have supervised the work.

When is the submission deadline?

All required documents must be fully submitted by the conference paper submission deadline. Submitting additional documents afterwards this deadline is not possible.

How is the submission made?

Submission is done through the ordinary conference's paper management system. A checkmark can be set to register for the competition.

Who is evaluating the contributions?

The jury is composed of members of the DGBMT's Education and Training Committee, as well as other individuals and members of the DGBMT. Decisions by the jury are final and filing appeals against the selections made by the jury is not possible.
